SUPPLEMENTAL RULES 2017

The AMA Racing Rulebook applies to All AMA Dist. 16 organized events. AMA Dist.16 Organized events include but are not limited to Competition, meets, banquets and awards ceremonies. All Participants living within Dist.16 boundaries must be a Competition member of the AMA or the ATVA, and hold a current District 16 Registration Card.

- Motorcycle Classes are Divided into two main categories: Youth and Amateur

Youth Motorcycle Classes for riders 4 through 15 years of age are:

- Two 0-51cc Stock classes are for riders 4 through 8 years of age, a four stroke and a shaft driven. The Suzuki JR 50cc and its Kawasaki counterpart will run in the shaft class provided they have stock gearing. Any 50cc bike found to be illegal will result in disqualification of the rider from that event, and the rider to be further suspended for the next three events in all classes! If Necessary, this would carry over to the following year.
- 50cc DTX Senior; 7-8 year old riders. 0-51cc 2 or 4-stroke motorcycles. Single speed Automatic transmission. Maximum wheelbase of 41". Maximum wheel size 12", OEM Parts Must be Used.
- 65cc; for riders 7 through 11 years old
- 85cc; for riders 7 through 15 years old

Amateur Class for riders 12 and older

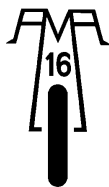
- 125cc-250cc

Amateur Classes for riders 14 and older

- 251cc-5005cc
- Open cc, (250cc and up)
- Beginner Class; 125cc or bigger motor on a full sized motorcycle (no pit bikes). Will Not run at half miles; No end of year awards. Trophies at the discretion of the club or promoter. Rider may be moved up at any time of the season if their racing shows major improvements.
- Women's Class; 125cc or larger machines,

Amateur Classes for riders 18 and Older

- Twins & Vintage; 1980 and older (Includes air cooled 2-strokes, but excludes 4-valve singles greater than 400cc)
- Singles; 2 and 4-valve singles, any cc, 2-stroke motors allowed. Produced before 1990.
- Classics; 1961-1976, 250cc-400cc, brakeless bikes. Riders may be 14 years old to race.

Age Classes

- Vets; (30 & Older)
- Senior; (40 & Older)
- Super Senior; (50 & Older)

Dash Class

Top three riders in 250cc, 505cc, and Open Am, plus any Pro's to create a 12 racer field to race at the end of the program. A \$50 award (e.g. gift card) supplied by the club/promoter. Class does not have to run if a curfew is up! There is no heat race, and will be the last race for the event. 4th place and back are Not Eligible to run this class.

Quad Classes are divided into two categories; Youth and Amateur

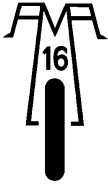
- Youth Stock and Youth Jr. Mod. Quad classes; Riders 6-12 years of age, No end of year awards, must have 5 to run. Promoter, or club option to run or not at their event, Will not run on Half Miles.
- Senior Youth; ages 12-15, Production Machines, 0-250cc 2-stroke, or 0-400cc 4-stroke, Mandatory tether switch.

Quad Classes 16 and older

- Quad C; No cc limit
- Quad B; No cc limit, No Quad C Riders
- Open Quad; No cc limit, No Quad C Riders
- Top Quad; No cc limit, No Quad C Riders, riders from Quad B or Open quad welcome, 80% of entry fees will make up the purse for the top three finishers. Quad B riders will be eligible for contingency awards.

Machine Equipment Required

- Number plates; All competition number plates will be White (minimum 8" x10") with Black numbers. No letters or stickers with the exception of earned National "N" or Pro designation can be placed on front number plate. Number plate must be on front and both sides. ATV front number plate must be vertical to front of machine, and both side plates, with a plate on rear of machine as well.
- Riding Numbers; All riders must use last 2 digits of there AMA or ATVA card number, or the single digit number they earned the previous year. Three digit numbers Are Not allowed.
- Tires; Class C tires are required on the rear wheel of all motorcycles with the exception of mini cycles. Knobby tires are not allowed on ATV's

- Sound; a decibel meter will be used to ensure all entrants are within legal limits. (94DBA)
- Ice Racing; All Machines Must have Working Tether Switch, Quads and Motorcycles.

Rider Information

- Scoring; When a red flag occurs, the clock will keep running until the heat race is completed
- Points; points are issued 20-16-13-11-10-9etc. down to four for all classes. To receive points, riders must be on the line for the start of the semi, or final event. Those eliminated from the final through a semi will receive 4 points for participation for their days effort. In case of a rain out during sign-up, or the event, riders will be given 5 participation points for their efforts.
- Rough Riding; Rough riding by any participant will not be tolerated. First offence will result in warning. The second offence will result in the rider missing the next two races, the third offence will cause the rider to forfeit all their points earned to that time and be suspended for the remainder of the season. If a rider hits a cone, they will be docked one position the first time it occurs, docked a lap the second time, and out for the day if a third time occurs. Flagman, corner workers, or Referees will make the judgment call on this.
- Wrong Class; Either the track referee or the district referee may move a rider they feel that person is participating in the wrong class at any time
- Pro Classes; A 450 and or Open Pro may be offered to racers carrying a current AMA Racing Pro card. Rider entry fee will make up the 100% payout. The same bike may be used for both classes, provided it fits the displacement listed. If there is no Pro Class a Pro rider May enter an Amateur class. However, they Will Not be scored or given a trophy while competing in that class.
- Late Sign-up Fee; Late sign-up fee, up to double the normal fee may be charged

Any rider with an injury may bring any bike to the start line to earn last place points in the class they have signed up for. If they are competing and wreck their bike in any manner, they must bring that bike to the line for their race. In either case, Proper riding gear must be worn.

Club/Promoter Information

- Rental of start light system will be \$50 per day.
- The Trackside scoring system, computer/printer, is available at a rental fee of \$70. This money goes to the AMA Dist. 16 Council
- Late sign-up fee, up to double may be charged for riders.
- Rain Date Make-ups must be cleared with Dist. Referee before publishing to the public.
