



Off-Road Series Supplemental Rules

- 1. The following disciplines are included in the Off-Road Series: Hare Scramble, Grand Prix and Enduro
- 2. *AMA District 16 points series will be held from April 1st to October 10th. Any events outside of the series dates will not be points paying events. All points will be awarded for current year only.
- 3. Points will be totalized together as one's series.
- 4. Rider Participation: All riders participating in the event must be registered with District 16 if required by the following points:
 - A) All participants living within the District 16 boundaries must be a member of the AMA and possess or purchase a current District 16 membership card. Verification is the responsibility of the hosting club/promoter.
 - B) Clubs and promoters holding competitive events shown on the AMA District 16 schedule, points and non-points paying, not verifying and selling District 16 Registration cards will be considered in violation of the rule 1. Clubs / promoters accepting seven or more event riders without District 16 cards will pay a \$100 fee for each event/day. An additional \$10 per rider will be charged for the eighth such rider entry, and each additional rule-2 violation entry at this event. Excessive violation of this rule may also place future event scheduling in jeopardy, as determined by the District 16 board. PROTESTS AND OFFENSES A. The AMA rule book and the District 16 Supplemental rules will be observed. If these must be modified in the best interests of the overall event, a three-person committee of neutral parties, including the event referee, the District referee and one other person will make the required decisions.
- 6. The AMA Racing Rule Book applies to all AMA District 16 organized events. AMA District 16 organized events include but are not limited to competition, meetings, banquets and awards ceremonies. All participants living within District 16 boundaries must be a Competition member of the AMA and hold a current district 16 registration card.

8. Class details/descriptions:

50cc Beginner Ages 4-8 Entry level class.

50cc Senior Ages 4-8 65cc Ages 7-11

85cc/ Big wheel Ages 9-15. Bikes must be between 66cc and 85cc (two stroke) or up to 150cc liquid or

air cooled four strokes. All bikes to have a minimum 14" rear wheel and have up to a 16"

rear wheel and up to a 19" front wheel.

9. Points/Awards:

A. Points will only be awarded to riders with a current District 16 card.

1. Points will not be retroactive. Points start from the date of purchase of your District card.

B. Rider may receive District 16 season awards in up to 1 class.

C. To receive district points at an event, a rider must complete at least one lap.

D. District points will be awarded for each overall score. Please see chart below:

- E. *Rider's best 12 overall finishes will count toward their season point total.
 - 1. In the event of cancellations, we will drop the best overall finishes by 1 event. for every two cancellations.
- F. *Riders must enter a minimum of 50% of points races (in the class they are competing in for points) to receive possible year end recognition.
- G. Riders will receive points based on place finished.
 - 1.*No advancement for out of district riders will be given for points.

- 10. Worker Points: Riders will receive worker points for up to three events per year in which they work an event. For the first event of the year a rider works, they will receive 35 points towards their class and state ranking total. For the second events of the year that a rider works, they will receive 21 points or their average finish whichever is higher for that event.
- 11. Designated sweepers will run throughout the entire day of racing. No one else is allowed on the track.
- 12. Aid of a downed rider:
 - A. A racer who stops to aid another rider who has sustained serious injuries will be awarded the average of his/her season points for that event.
 - B. OR If the racer can complete the event, the racers laps effected by the down rider situation will be adjusted according to the average of the previous laps in that event.
 - C. The helping racer must remain with the injured rider until qualified help arrives.
- 13. Class advancement will be determined by the official AMA Advancement system and/or if a rider wins their class two consecutive years the AMA District 16 Director may advance the rider.
- 14. If District 16 is scoring a club/promoter's event, an entry fee of \$1.00 (subject to change) per entrant will be due the day of the event. This fee should be given to the District Director and made payable to AMA District 16 Council. All riders regardless of district affiliation are included for this fee.
- 15. Clubs/Promoters will provide a minimum of three people to assist with registration and scoring. Two people are need for scoring. One should have computers skills and the other will manually hand enter racer laps. The third person will be handling sign up. This person should have STRONG computer skill as this is racer entry. The District Director will train volunteers in the morning at the start of the days event.
- 16. Clubs will give free entry to the District Director or a District Director's appointed person as well as one guest. Free race entries will also be given to the District Director or appointed person.
- 17. Protests and Offenses: The AMA rule book and AMA District 16 Supplemental rules will be observed. If these must be modified in the best interests of the overall event, a three-person committee of neutral parties, including the Event Referee, the District Director and one other person will make the required decisions.

Hare Scrambles:

1. Course length requirements per class:

50cc Beginner/50cc Senior Minimum of 0.5 miles 65cc/85cc/Supermini Minimum of 1.5 miles C,+50, Vintage Minimum of 2.5 miles AA,A,B,C,+40,+30 Minimum of 2.5 miles

- 2. All motorcycles must have matching clear numbers on all 3 number plates.
- 3. Colored number plate backgrounds to designate classes are recommended below:

AA: Red	A: White	B: Yellow	C: Black
+40: Blue	+50: Green	+60: White

Grand Prix:

1. Course length requirements per class:

50cc Beginner/50cc Senior length is up to the club 65cc/85cc/Supermini Minimum of 1 mile C,+50, Vintage Minimum of 2.0 miles AA,A,B,C,+40,+30 Minimum of 2. miles

- 2. All motorcycles must have matching clear numbers on all 3 number plates.
- 3. Colored number plate backgrounds to designate classes are recommended below:

AA: Red	A: White	B: Yellow	C: Black
+40: Blue	+50: Green	+60: White

The starts will be a mass start in waves, 10 to 30 seconds apart, in the order listed above. Any planned variations in classes or order must be approved by the referee at least 2 weeks prior to the event.

Enduro

- 1. District 16 points will be awarded as follows:
 - A. Enduro's of 50 miles or more.
 - B. Closed Course Enduro's of 3 miles or more covered three or more times.
 - C. Sprint Enduro's with each test a minimum of 2 miles and run a minimum of three times.
 - D. Riders must have made it at least to the first check point to receive district points for that event.

2. Enduro Equipment:

- A. Equipment must be manufactured for the express purpose of being used on motorcycles and the equipment must be mounted in a safe and secure manner.
- B. All motorcycles must have a safe and securely fitted exhaust silencer/ US Forestry approved spark arrester for open course enduro's which must be intact at the end of the enduro.
- C. It is recommended by the District 16 Council that an equipment check be made by the Event Referee and/or the District Director at the time of the enduro. Any malfunctioning equipment must be repaired to the referee's satisfaction or the rider will be disqualified.
- D. Riders are to make every reasonable effort to compete on a motorcycle that is at or below the AMA's 96 decibel limit at all events where the promoting club does not require a sound check to be passed before competition.

3. Competitor Behavior:

- A. Riders should not put themselves in a position to jeopardize other riders, land, animals, and/or spectators.
- B. Slower riders should give way to faster riders.
- C. Riders should report all unusual conditions to persons operating checkpoints, referees, layout crews, and/or the police.
- D. Riders should refrain from smoking in fire hazard areas.

4. General Rules:

- A. Final scoring may be done at the starting point. You may or may not elect to have an observed check at the finish point if this option is used. However, these conditions must be spelled out on the route sheet so all riders are informed.
- B. When a rider carries his own score card and loses it, 10% of the points lost will be assessed with a minimum of one point, and any fractional parts will be rounded off to the next highest whole number. The affected rider must be scored upon request to the referee. District 16 riders must identify their score cards with a 16 within a circle on the top of the score care to get district 16 points. For those events scored electronically, and have backup scores taken, the electronic identification tag or transponder will be treated like the riders score card for this rule.
- C. Those riders who are classified as AMA District 16 B Riders will be notified prior to the first enduro or at signup. All C class trophy winners will be checked against AMA District B rider list at each event. If a District B rider is found to have entered as a C rider, that rider will be disqualified for that day's event.
- D. If you host an enduro, the following classes are required, including the youth classes: 50cc Beginner, 50cc Senior, 65cc, 85cc/Supermini (All youth classes must have a closed course enduro) AA, A, B, C, +30, +40, +50 and Vintage.
